	Course offer in German: Students with sufficient German skills find the course offer <u>here</u> (click on the desired degree programme and 'Studieninhalte' to find the curriculum).
Course selection for incoming students:	If needed, exchange students may mix lectures from different degree programmes, provided there are no time clashes. This does not apply to iLab and EPS. Students of 'Media Technology, Bachelor' are asked to choose the EPS or iLab, as places in the German taught courses of the 1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup> year are limited.
	Subjects offered in the 1 <sup>st</sup> , 3 <sup>rd</sup> and 5 <sup>th</sup> semester can only be chosen in the winter semester. Subjects offered in the 2 <sup>nd</sup> , 4 <sup>th</sup> and 6 <sup>th</sup> semester can only be chosen in the summer semester.
	Incoming students wishing to take subjects from the master degree programmes must have sufficient knowledge of the respective subjects, as all of these courses are at an advanced level.
