Compulsory health insurance	Health insurance must be proven before registration. EC students: Please bring your European insurance card (EHIC). Additional travel insurance and personal liability insurance is recommended.
Visa	EC and US Students do not need a visa to enter the country. Residence permit can be applied for in Kiel (2 passport photos, registration at FH Kiel, proof of funds or scholarship to cover living expenses in Germany). Other international students are asked to contact the German embassy in their home country. Do not enter with a tourist visa!
Housing	A survey of dormitories in Kiel can be downloaded from our website. They offer mostly simple single rooms with shared bathroom and kitchen facilities. They do not suit everybody, but they are an easy step to get in touch with German and other foreign students. Costs: approx. 250€ to 400€ per month, plus a one month deposit (in most circumstances). These rooms are normally only available to rent for a complete semester. (September – February/March - August). The number of dormitory rooms is limited. Reservation should be made as early as possible (the deadlines for applications are set as 15th January and 15th June).
Fees	There are no tuition fees at FH Kiel. However, all students have to pay an ad-ministration fee of approx. 265€ per semester to the student union, which includes free public transport (i.e. bus, ferry and train) in Kiel, across Schleswig-Holstein and Hamburg.
Statement of Financial Ressources (non-EU students only)	Please bring a statement of your financial ressources, demonstrating that there are sufficient funds to cover all expenses of living while staying in Kiel.
Costs of Living per month:	Approximately: 800€

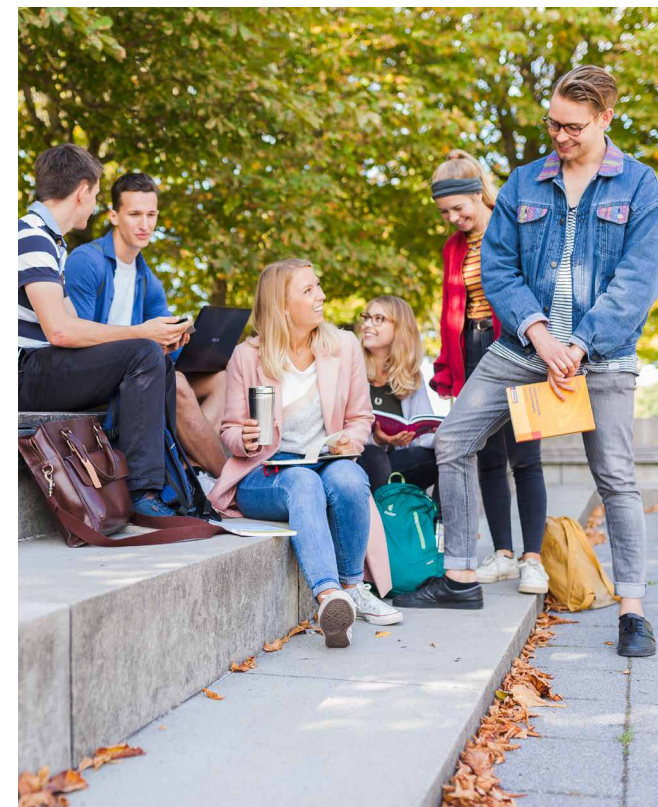

flat-hunting terms to know

On your search for new accommodations you might stumble across a lot of abbreviations. The most important ones are explained below.

Abstand

You have to buy part of the furniture from the previous tenant.

kalt

cold, i.e. heating and other utilities costs have to be paid in addition to the rent.

Kaution

Deposits - in Germany, it is normal to pay a deposit of up to three months' rent which is refunded at the end of the contract. If any damage has been done, the landlord is allowed to withhold the amount of the money needed for the repairs from the deposit.

möbliert

The room is fully furnished.

zzgl. NK

zuzüglich Nebenkosten: i.e. plus utilities charges

NMM

"Net monthly rent" (heating, electricity, water, etc. are not included)

teilmöbliert

The room/flat has some furnishing, but not all that might be necessary

warm

warm, i.e. heating and other utilities costs are included in the rent.

Zwischenmiete

Sub-letting: The leaser rents the room to another for a specified time, often furnished (normally between 3 and 6 months).
