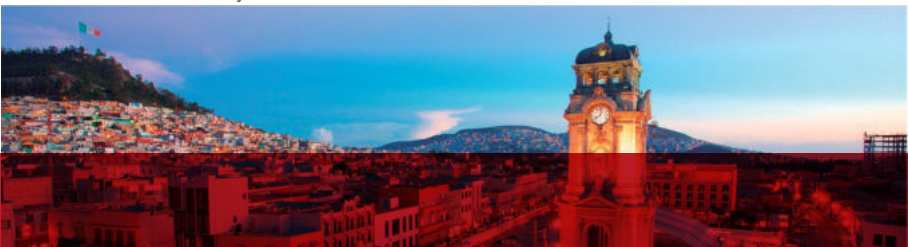

The International Image Festival (FINI) provides an international forum where artists, students and academics from all over the world can participate in a contest with their photographs, films, and poster works.



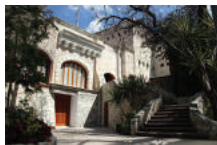

Spanish Language and Culture Course

The UAEH offers a Spanish Language and Culture Course to international students who are enrolled in the Academic Mobility Programs (Spanish SIELE Certification).

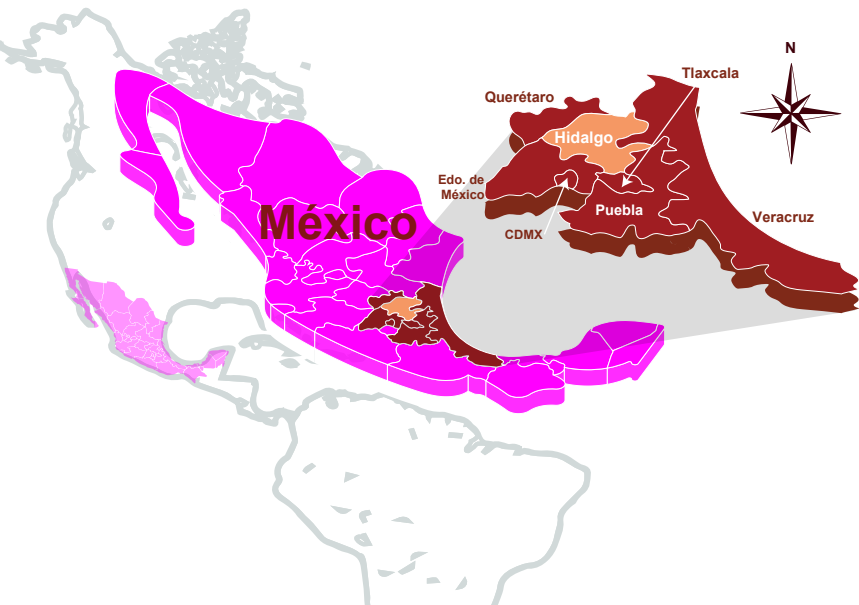




Hidalgo's local food

Hidalgo and other cities:

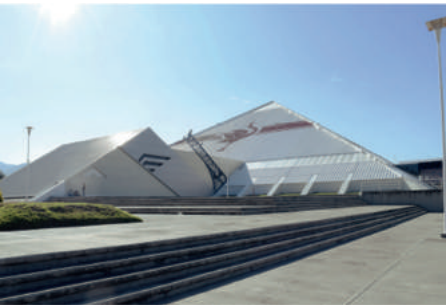

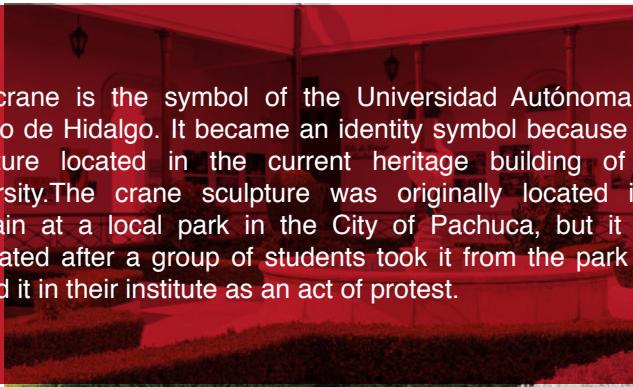

The crane is the symbol of the Universidad Autónoma del Estado de Hidalgo. It became an identity symbol because of a sculpture located in the current heritage building of the university. The crane sculpture was originally located in a fountain at a local park in the City of Pachuca, but it was re-located after a group of students took it from the park and placed it in their institute as an act of protest.
