

I would definitely go back to this university if I could go back in time since it is one of the biggest universities in Poland and I had an amazing experience learning there.




Practical informations


I did not need a visa since I am allowed to stay for a maximum amount of 3 months if I do not leave the country, but since I knew I was going to do a lot of traveling the visa application was not necessary because every time you leave the country, the 3 months of maximum stay resets.



I travelled to Krakow using Ryanair from Toulouse, Marseille was also an option but it depends on the price of course. I was a bit late to get the tickets because I was renewing my passports and wanted to make sure all my documents were fine before booking, and finally booked 1-2 weeks from departure and I arrived 2 days before my classes start.

Regarding the luggage I recommend to not over pack I got more stuff than I needed, especially for winter clothes which I used for just one month before it got hot. Depending on when the semester starts its better to get less stuff so its easier when you leave if you are going to get stuff from the receiving country. One puffer jacket was enough and mostly useful for me.






I recommend the Milestone student dorm because it has a lot of advantages all included, and most of the residents are Erasmus students so it is much easier to blend in with everyone from the start. And it has a really good location with a tram stop 5min away and near the center.

I wouldn't recommend the university dorms personally because I found it complicated since you live in the same room with someone you don't know with beds opposite to each other and he could not be an Erasmus, share the same bathroom, a common kitchen in the hallway and washing machine with no driers.

I personally didn't like it but it could be good because of the low price at 100 euros per month.



The university dorms were very cheap (100 euros) per month, but for milestone it was about **470 euros** for single bedroom or **370 euros** for double bedroom with a roommate but there are also some extra costs for the first payment like cleaning fees etc... which is about 100 euros.

An introduction to visual culture studies


