## NOMINATIONS & APPLICATIONS

<b>Nomination process</b>	Students must be nominated <b>by partner universities</b> via the Unibo <b>online nomination platform</b> . Email nominations are not accepted. The link to the platform changes each academic year and will be sent to partner universities when the nomination period opens.

<b>Nomination deadlines</b>	First semester/Full year – <b>1 July</b> Second semester – <b>1 December</b>
<b>Application process</b>	Detailed information is available <a href="#">here</a>
<b>Application deadline</b>	There is <b>no fixed deadline</b> . However, students must register on the Unibo platform after receiving the acceptance message and must submit their Learning Agreement <b>before the start of their mobility period</b> .

## LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

### Recommended language skills

There are no specific language requirements (except for medical, nursing and veterinary students). However, before starting their mobility period students are strongly advised to have at least

- a basic knowledge of Italian (level A2) and
- a B1 (Bachelor)/B2 (Master) level of English to be able to study and make the most of the lectures.

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### Language certificate

No official language certificate is required.

### Grading system

The University of Bologna uses a grading **scale out of 30**. The **minimum passing grade is 18/30**. The examination board may also award honours (lode). More information about ECTS grading tables can be found at the following link:
