## Our Nomination Procedure

Nominations are to be submitted digitally via the nomination form sent by UL Global each year. The nominated student's information should be submitted by their Home University. Nominations should include the student's name, email address, area of study, the Erasmus+ code of the Institution, and International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED)

Nomination deadline for Autumn Semester and Full Year: **May 1st**

Nomination deadline for Spring Semester: **October 1st**

## Our Application Procedure

Once the student has been officially nominated, they will receive an email with an application link and a guide to the online application procedure. Applicants will require a recent Transcript, verifiable proof of Identification and recent proof of a B2 English language level to complete their application. Once students have completed their application, they will be emailed with further information regarding accommodation, modules, etc.

Application deadline for Autumn Semester and Full Year: **May 31st**

Application deadline for Spring Semester: **October 31st**

## Modules

A normal semester load at the University of Limerick is 30 ECTS credits. Most modules have a credit weighting of 6 ECTS so students should take five modules per semester. Erasmus+ students are required to take a majority of modules from their field of study. Erasmus+ Students can take between three and six modules while in UL. Acceptance on these modules is subject to academic prerequisites, timetabling constraints and number of students enrolled. [Students can preview the modules that are available for both Autumn and Spring semesters.](#)

Modules offered in Psychology, Sports Sciences and Journalism are in high demand each year. Students nominated within the relevant subject areas are permitted first access to the modules in those areas

## ECTS Credits

The normal course load at the University of Limerick is 5 modules per semester. Erasmus+ students are limited to a maximum of 6 modules and a minimum of 3 modules per semester. Most UL modules are worth 6 ECTS credits.

## Learning Agreement Requirement

Students are required to send their Learning Agreement directly to their academic coordinator at the University of Limerick for approval of modules. If a student is using an online learning agreement they must enter their academic coordinator's contact email as the responsible person in UL. Details of the students' academic coordinator in the University of Limerick will be sent to them after their nomination has been processed, student's should only submit their learning agreement once they receive this information.

## Language Requirements

The language of instruction and assessment for all programmes in the University of Limerick is English (with the exception of foreign language modules, e.g. French, German, Spanish, Japanese). A B2 level of English is required and certification confirming this is necessary to complete your application. Students may check and see if their English level [qualification](#) is accepted. English as a Foreign Language course is available to Erasmus+ students as a module.

The Language Centre of the University of Limerick offers a General English Year-Round Programme which includes standard and intensive language courses. This is suitable for students with various levels of English who wish to improve their general English language skills.

## Academic Transcripts

A softcopy of each student transcripts will be emailed to the Partner Institution and the student, by the University of Limerick. The PDF will be issued within 5 weeks of publication of UL results online. Students may also access their results online via the student portal prior to receiving their results via email. You may check the dates when semester results are released on the UL [academic calendar](#).

## Counselling Services

UL offers a counselling service called [UL Student Counselling and Wellbeing Service](#). This is a free and confidential service acting as a first point of contact for mental health needs. ## How to find us

### Getting to University of Limerick

#### **Dublin Airport: ~200 km from Limerick (DIRECT option)**

**Dublin Coach Bus:** change at the Red Cow for Limerick, drop-off at UL bus stop. **This bus route takes students directly to UL Campus.**

**Citylink Bus:** drop-off opposite Hurler's Pub, 20 minute walk to UL Campus

**Flightlink Bus:** drop-off opposite Hurler's Pub, 20 minute walk to UL Campus

#### **Shannon Airport: ~25 km from Limerick**

**Bus:** There is a bus service from Shannon Airport to Limerick City Train station approximately every hour.

**Taxi:** Prices for taxis from Shannon airport to the University of Limerick vary - between 50-65 Euro.
